Hong Kong's Legislative Council votes down same-sex partnership bill

The closely-watched bill that proposed recognising same-sex partnerships was voted down in Hong Kong's "all-patriots" legislature on Wednesday

"Many countries in Asia moved to legalise same sex-partnership in recent years. Even if passed, the HK vote was half-heart comparatively; only overseas marriages would've been recognised. Moreover, it is the Constitutional and Mainland Affairs Bureau who'll be overseeing these registrations.

Today's 'NO' vote shows Beijing's appointed HK legislators ignored HK's judiciary system. HK's top court effectively ordered the government to come up with a framework for registering same-sex partnership.


